## ***Outpost Racer: Design and Rules***

The outpost racer competition will have two categories: design and racing. Within the racing competition category, there are three divisions: Discovery, Adventure, and Expedition Rangers. Each division will have a first, second, and third place winner. The design category will also have a first, second, and third place winner. If you want to enter just the racing event and compete for the racing trophies, your outpost will build the standard racer as we have done in past years. Plans are provided on the next page for those needing to build a racer this year.

If your outpost wants to compete in the design category and compete for the design trophies, then your “vehicle” must be theme related and must be able to race (though you have the option of racing it or not). Guidelines are as follows:

1. The vehicle must be designed with the Pow-Wow theme in mind.
2. the racing style model from last year with painted cosmetic changes probably won't qualify this year. We are looking for vehicles that have a distinct look and distinct construction that clearly identifies it with the Pow-Wow theme.
3. The vehicle must be able to race and be safe, but does not have to compete in the racing event in order to compete in the design event. Required dimensions must be met.

**Note: your outpost may enter both the design and racing events with the same vehicle. Of course, it would have to be theme related. Your outpost may enter two vehicles, one for design and one for racing.**

### **Racing Rules**

1. Cars must meet specification for width of wheel base, length of wheel base, type and size of wheels (see the next page for specifications). Racer frame must be made of wood.
2. Drivers who crash into other racers will forfeit that race. The other racer/driver will automatically be declared the winner. This forfeiture decision is made by the judges at the time of the race and is a non-contestable decision.
3. A vehicle that is judged unsafe by the racing judges will not be allowed to race. This vehicle may be entered in the design competition if it meets design specifications. This rule will not be “nit-picky”, but will be used to disqualify obviously unsafe vehicles. Two or more judges must concur to disqualify a vehicle as unsafe.
4. One car may compete in three levels of the racing event (Discovery, Adventure, and Expedition Rangers). Bring cars to the Saturday formation for registration and inspection. Please have the outpost number on the car.
5. Each car must have an approved bicycle or motorcycle style helmet, knee pads, and elbow pads for inspection. Drivers must wear the helmet and pads when racing.
6. Steering device must be a rope steering device permanently attached to the car's steering axle.
7. The car must have seat belts attached to the frame. No bungee cords and/or rope can be used.
8. Wood blocks must be secured to the front axle at ¾” on either side of the mainframe (E) to help prevent over steering while racing. See item B on the design sheet.
9. A wood panel must be secured to the front axle support to keep the boy's feet of the ground and can be used as a braking device. See item D on the design sheet. Other braking devices are acceptable.
10. Each car must have a working braking device.

## ***Outpost Racer Basic Design***

These plans are provided to assist you in your design and construction of your outpost racer. There are nine requirements for qualification in the racing and design events:

1. Length of Wheel Base;
2. Width of Wheel Base;
3. Size of Wheel;
4. Rope Steering;
5. Seat Belts;
6. Block Device to Prevent Over Steering;
7. Wood Panel to Prevent Driver's Feet From Scraping the Ground;
8. Working Braking Device; and
9. Overall Safe Condition (as Determined by the Judges).

### **Required Dimensions:**

1. Length of Wheel Base:
  - a. From center of front axle to center of rear axle no less than 42" and no more than 50".
2. Width of Wheel Base:
  - a. From center of left wheel to center of right wheel no less than 27" and no more than 32".
3. Wheels:
  - a. No ball bearings and/or sleeved hubs. Plastic or neoprene hubs only.
  - b. No less than 7" in diameter and no more than 9" in diameter.
  - c. Lubricant on hubs and axles OK.

### **Basic Outpost Racer:**

- A. 2" x 4" x 27" wooden axle supports.
- B. Wood blocks secured to front axle at  $\frac{3}{4}$ " on either side of the main frame.
- C.  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5" lg diameter bolt with necessary washers and nuts for steering axle.
- D. 15" x 23" x  $\frac{1}{8}$ " wood panel.
- E. 2" x 6" x 52" wood main frame.
- F. 12" x 18" x  $\frac{3}{4}$ " wood seat back.
- G. 12" x 18" x  $\frac{3}{4}$ " wood seat.
- H. 2" x 6" x 12" back support posts (2 needed).
- I.  $\frac{1}{8}$ " back support panels, 7  $\frac{1}{2}$ " at top, 15" vertical, and 11" across bottom.
- J. U-bolts to secure axle (min 2 per axle).
- K. Wheels (see required dimensions).
- L.  $\frac{1}{2}$ " steel axle or equal.

## ***Patrol Judging Tips***

### ***Campsite***

Camp set up according to guidelines in *Adventures in Camping*. Campsite entrance is well designed, has the outpost number, is consistent with the theme, was made by the boys, is colorful, large, and attention-getting. Attributes of a good campsite include: all required areas present and well designated; garbage bags closed, covered, and not overflowing; fire pit properly constructed; tents organized inside and out, zipped closed when not in use; dining canopy properly set up; tool safety area well designated with ropes; tools properly stored; tool rack built; bulletin board set up with schedule and other required schedules; dishwashing station built; first aid kit visible and accessible. Bonus points may be awarded for additional camp craft projects. Points may be taken away if the campsite has unclean dishes, trash on the ground, unattended campsite, tents not set up in a safe way (under dangerous limbs, etc.); clothes or towels draped over tents; unsafe use of tools; or other unacceptable conditions.

### ***Patrol Spirit***

“Patrol Spirit” means that boys within a patrol identify themselves and behave as a team. Attributes of Patrol Spirit include a patrol standard or other means of identifying the patrol, patrol name consistent with the theme, boys work and play together as a group; patrol dressed the same; patrol song is consistent with the theme and has a positive Christian message; boys memorize the song; patrol sings the song enthusiastically when called upon at assemblies; the song involves appropriate action and movement; patrol yell which is consistent with the theme, performed enthusiastically; memorized by patrol members. Patrols are encouraged to develop a patrol skit and perform it upon request in assemblies or in judging. Points will be awarded for creativity, color, consistency with Pow-Wow theme, and positive message. Points may be taken away for unruly behavior, tardiness at assemblies and meetings, or other behavior not reflecting a positive Christian witness.

### ***Patrol and Individual Skills***

Skill competition is designed to require application of Ranger Skills, possibly in a challenging environment requiring creativity. Encourage boys to practice basic skills.
